Holy Communion

In Holy Communion the crucified and risen Christ is present, giving his true body and blood as food and drink. All baptized Christians are invited to the table where Christ himself is host. If you desire to be baptized, or to learn more about Holy Baptism, please speak to the pastor.

As We Gather:

Baptism is about who we are and who we are called to be. This is made abundantly clear as Matthew narrates Jesus' own baptism in the Jordan. But the voice ringing out from the heavens speaks not just to Jesus himself, but to all those gathered that day, and even us in this time and place. "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am pleased." It is clear that God was pointing out Jesus as the Messiah, but the same sentiment can be said of each of us as well. We are God's beloved today. So while baptism is about God calling us, it is also about God calling us for the sake of the people around us. Baptism propels us from the font into the arms of community. A community that is equipped for ministry in the world that desperately needs to hear the Good News. A community that is the beloved Body of Christ for the world of this day and age.
